
You need to include the full street address of all nominations.

Public Rights of Way

The Town Council has approached North Lincolnshire Council to request current paths and routes which are not on the definitive map of Public Rights of Way are added to it to secure their use for the future. The areas highlighted are Moat House Road to Cornwall Street, Wesley Street to Traingate, Duck Lane and paths within the grounds of St Andrew's United Church. In order to apply for these paths to be officially Public Rights of Way, community support is required in the form of evidence statements to confirm to confirm that the routes are open to the public and not private and that they have and will continue to use them. If you would lend support in securing these paths for future use, please contact the Town Council for an evidence form to complete. Maps showing the locations of these paths in purple dashed lines are shown below. If you have other paths in mind which are not included here, please get in touch with your suggestions.

North Lincolnshire Residents' Panel

Residents in North Lincolnshire can now register their interest in joining the 'Residents' Panel' to have their say on living in the area. The online panel is due to launch in early 2020 and will be made up of local people who the council will contact to get a better understanding of residents' views on local issues. To register your interest in joining the Residents' Panel, go to the North Lincolnshire Council website. Anybody who is aged 16 or above and lives in North Lincolnshire can apply to join the panel. To ensure that the panel is representative of North Lincolnshire's diverse population, acceptance onto the panel is not automatic. People will be contacted in early 2020 to let them know if they have been accepted or not. Anyone who is not accepted will be added to a reserve list. People whose work brings them in to contact with North Lincolnshire residents' can also help by supporting the promotion of the panel as widely as possible.
