Announcement 21/03/2020

Kirton in Lindsey Town Council is responding to the current situation and making every available opportunity for support for this community.

On Tuesday 17th March the Town Council's Emergency Plan was activated, and this has resulted in the move to reach out to everyone in the community to reassure, advise and provide contacts of help, assistance or even just a chat. The Town Council Office was also closed to the public until further notice, however you can still use the contact details below to get in touch.

Over the same week the Town Council has coordinated the offers of assistance from residents and businesses and has seen, as always, how Kirton in Lindsey is always ready to support itself and others.

The Town Council joined forces with Kirton First and a special edition leaflet was delivered to you all over the weekend of 21/22nd March detailing sources of up to date advice and a list of Core Contacts who anyone can reach out to for help, assistance and support of any kind. The information is also displayed around the town in prominent places. These Core Contacts have access to a list of all the volunteers who have come forward. This will enable a swift response to any request for help received whether for advice, information, reassurance, a delivery of supplies or anything else.

On Saturday 21st March the Town Council held an Extraordinary Meeting in the Town Hall garden and has put in place unprecedented measures to devolve the work of the Town Council and decision making to the Clerk, Mayor and Deputy Mayor. All scheduled meetings are cancelled until further notice and the focus of all members is now on the immediate needs of this community.

On Monday 23rd March the difficult decision was made to close the play area on the Green and the Town Council ask for all residents support in this measure to reinforce social distancing measures to protect the community.

We ask that you look out for each other as you always do, but now this more important than ever. You know the road or street you live on best and will know by instinct if something doesn't look right. Does your neighbour need something or is there some suspicious activity? Make sure your neighbours know that there are sources of assistance available, and to use the Core Contacts to ask for help or report any concerns.

The Town Council will continue to report updates and provide relevant information going forward, however do not hesitate to get in touch should you need to.
