### Update from Kirton in Lindsey Town Council - COVID-19 Response



Kirton in Lindsey Town Council continues to put steps into place to support the community by all available means as the lockdown measures ease and facilities and services become available again.

1. The COVID-19 Community Response team, put into place on 17th March remains available for the community.
2. The play area on the re-opened on 4<sup>th</sup> July. You should read the guidance and information provided on the Town Council website prior to allowing children in your care to use the play equipment.
3. The cemetery at Grove Street remains open and accessible, as it has throughout.
4. The Town Council has begun to hold monthly virtual meetings in order to continue to progress matters for the community and update ongoing projects. The meetings are open to the public to join, just contact the Town Clerk for all the details you will need once the Agenda is published.
5. The Town Council Office is again open to the public but on an appointment basis - the Town Council is still accessible to you via phone, email or post. ## **Traigate Project – We Need Your Support**



Tony Bartlett's proposals for a plinth with a vintage plough and a sculpted metal ploughman is developing into a reality. Representatives of the Town Council, Kirton in Lindsey In Bloom, Kirton in Lindsey Society and Kirton in Lindsey WI together with Traigate resident Tony Bartlett are working on ideas to both improve the visual attractiveness of the green space area at the top of Traigate and interpret its history.

As many residents are aware, Tony has, together with other neighbours, for a number of years created and maintained flower beds and grassed areas at the top of Traigate.

The concept behind Tony's plinth is one of reflection, showing how the town 'back in the day' was well known for its farming and market community. The statue represents the farmers and farmhands who ploughed, seeded and harvested the lands around our town for years and through war times keeping the spirit of the town going.

Tony approached the Town Council in order to progress his project. Due to the location and size of the feature, the Town Council agreed to apply for Planning Permission which received approval in May. The Town Council also applied for funding from North Lincolnshire Council to meet the £12,541 budget required to complete the construction and the purchase of material for the project. In full support of the concept, the Town Council also agreed to fund 10% of the project costs. North Lincolnshire Council funding was agreed in August for £10,000 which has left a shortfall of £886 to complete the project.

In order for the project to be completed further funding is required and we ask residents who support the project to consider donating to a Traigate Project Fund to meet the shortfall. The A Team have already provided a generous donation but to finish off the project further funding is still needed.

Event Update – At the virtual meeting of the Promoting Kirton Committee last night, the difficult decision was made around the provision of the annual Christmas Festival event. The Town Council is aware of its responsibilities to help keep the spread of COVID-19 under control for the protection and safety of all residents and so is unable to hold the event in the usual format. However, Christmas is not cancelled and other activities for the community to come together in different ways will be planned for the festive season.

- The Christmas lights and the town tree will still be in place to add some festive cheer and spirit, but there will be no ‘switch-on’ event.
- The Primary School children are again creating baubles which will be displayed on the town tree.
- The Christmas Lights competition will run for you to nominate the best decorated houses in the town as Christmas approaches.
- Other plans include an online 2020 Kirton in Lindsey Community Christmas Quiz and a family trail around the town.

The Town Council would like to support the local groups, charities and businesses who would usually take part in the Christmas Festival and who make it a success each year. The idea is to encourage residents to ‘shop local, support local’ and for this to include Christmas gifts. Each year a wide range of crafts are available during the Christmas Festival and a number of groups and organisations from the town and nearby put on games and challenges to raise vital funds.

There will be a showcase of the local groups, charities and businesses to encourage residents to continue to offer them support. ### **Just Go and train services**

North Lincolnshire's new on-demand rural bus service, Just Go, started taking bookings on 1 September.

The service is now welcoming passengers. To keep people safe social distancing measures are in place which does reduce the capacity of the buses.

People booking the service for leisure journeys are being asked to book after 9am so priority can be given to children travelling to school and people commuting to work.

The Saturday Only train services between Sheffield and Cleethorpes started calling at Kirton Lindsey Station again from Saturday the 19<sup>th</sup> of September.
