#### Town Council Meetings update



As the legislation allowing local councils to legally hold their meetings remotely came to an end on 6<sup>th</sup> May, and the government's plans do not currently include extending this legislation, the Town Council moved the Annual Council Meeting forward to 6<sup>th</sup> May and, unless the situation changes, has postponed further meetings until the end of June in order that all safety measures can be considered and meetings remain open to all members of the public.

#### Town Survey 2021

Kirton in Lindsey Town Council is conducting this survey in order to gain your views and opinions on aspects of the current facilities and events available within our town, in addition to proposed future amenities for our community.

The Town Council has a certain remit and is responsible for particular aspects of the town and community. An outline of the responsibilities of the Town Council – and what falls under the control of North Lincolnshire Council is displayed in the Town Council noticeboard, online and in the recent edition of Kirton First.



Existing facilities and events were created and are maintained using funding from a combination of the local element (Kirton in Lindsey)

within your annual Council Tax and various grants that are available to Local Authorities. For large projects, in addition to any supporting Grant Funding and North Lincolnshire Council support, Town Councils can access Public Works Loans, which are available at very low interest rates and repaid over many years to ensure minimal impact on annual Council Tax payments.

We need YOUR opinion on what we have within our community, and what you would like to see in the future so we can plan accordingly. We will let you know what results and opinions the survey reveals, and what the subsequent plans for the town will be.

A paper version of this survey will be available shortly to be delivered to households, in an attempt to reach as many residents as possible. More information about this will be published soon. The closing date for submissions will be published in advance when agreed.

#### Have your say on North Lincs ward boundaries

The Local Government Boundary Commission has launched a consultation which will lead to recommendations about new council wards and boundaries, as well as numbers of councillors. Local people are urged to take part and share their views on where ward boundaries should be and what they should be called. From 18 May to 26 July 2021, they are accepting opinions and comments on where you believe ward boundaries should be in North Lincolnshire Council. The Commission is minded to recommend that North Lincolnshire Council should have 43 councillors in the future. This is no change from the current number of councillors. #### <u>Traingate unveiling – Saturday 12th June at 2pm</u>



Tony Bartlett's project for a plinth with a vintage plough and a sculpted metal ploughman at the top of Traingate is nearly complete. Tony's vision to both improve the visual attractiveness of the green space area at the top of Traingate and interpret its history.

The concept behind Tony's plinth is one of reflection, showing how the town 'back in the day' was well known

for its farming and market community. The statue represents the farmers and farmhands who ploughed, seeded and harvested the lands around our town for years and through war times keeping the spirit of the town going. The plough is the genuine article of a local potato plough freshly painted to compliment the ploughman by Tony and Jean. Tony has named the structure "Grandad's Plough – In Memory of Harry and Fred Clarke".

Local trades including Jonathan Fallas and James Sutton have completed works to build the plinth and create the sculpture which will feature on it. Tony approached the Town Council in order to progress his project and due to the location and size of the feature, the Town Council agreed to apply for Planning Permission which received approval in May 2020. The Town Council also applied for funding from North Lincolnshire Council to meet the initial £12,541 budget required to complete the construction and the purchase of material for the project. In full support of the concept, the Town Council also agreed to fund 10% of the project costs. Generous donations were received from residents across the town in support of the project and have enabled all the associated costs to be met.

The project will be official unveiled on 12<sup>th</sup> June 2021 at 2pm as Tony has chosen the date to link the project with the Queen's Official Birthday. Traingate will be closed temporarily at the Wray Street and East Cross Street junctions to allow space for the unveiling to take place.
