A brief update on activities and news from Kirton in Lindsey Town Council.

Platinum Jubilee Events

On 2nd June 2022 at 2pm Bruce McKenzie stepped up as Town Crier, next to the Platinum Jubilee Beacon on the Green, Kirton in Lindsey.

The Proclamation was read to a crowd gathered, as the same message is conveyed across the United Kingdom and Commonwealth, to start the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations in honour of Queen Elizabeth II. The Platinum Jubilee Beacon was later lit at 9.45pm, in celebration as one of the estimated 3,500 beacons lit across the United Kingdom, British Overseas Territories and the capital cities of the Commonwealth.

Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee celebrations continued at Kirton in Lindsey on Saturday 4th June with the Street Party in the Market Place. Mayor of Kirton in Lindsey, Cllr Joy Kofoed officially opened Street Party and Bruce McKenzie again stepped up as Town Crier to announce the opening and welcome Swingamathing, the 40's & 50's Swing Band to begin the entertainment. We hope you enjoyed the community entertainment and opportunities to come together.

Kirton in Lindsey has received a Certificate of Grateful Recognition from Bruno Peek LVO OBE OPR, Pageantmaster, for the town's contribution to the Platinum Jubilee Beacons in the celebration of Her Majesty The Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Thank you to the many, many people involved behind the scenes in bringing these Platinum Jubilee Events to Kirton in Lindsey, so that our town is joining in with the wider celebrations.

Humberside Police news

Humberside Police provided opportunities for the community through the month, with free cycle marking and the adding of cycles to a national database on 9th June. This was to help deter potential thieves and increase the chances of the cycle being recovered/returned to the lawful owner, as well as providing vital evidence against persons suspected of being involved in the initial theft or handling the stolen property.

Those responses were all considered and collated and then passed to North Lincolnshire Council. When updates are received to confirm the works which will be carried out, we will update everyone.

Cemetery update

It is with the deepest regret that Kirton in Lindsey Town Council give notice **expiring at 4pm 14th July 2022** that some headstones will be laid down in the cemetery.

One of the duties of the Town Council is the maintenance of the Cemetery. Health and Safety legislation dictates that risks in the Cemetery must be controlled, including work to actively remove hazards posed by unstable memorial stones. As part of this, we recently had an independent inspection undertaken of all graves and headstones, which unfortunately showed 118 of them required repair, some major.

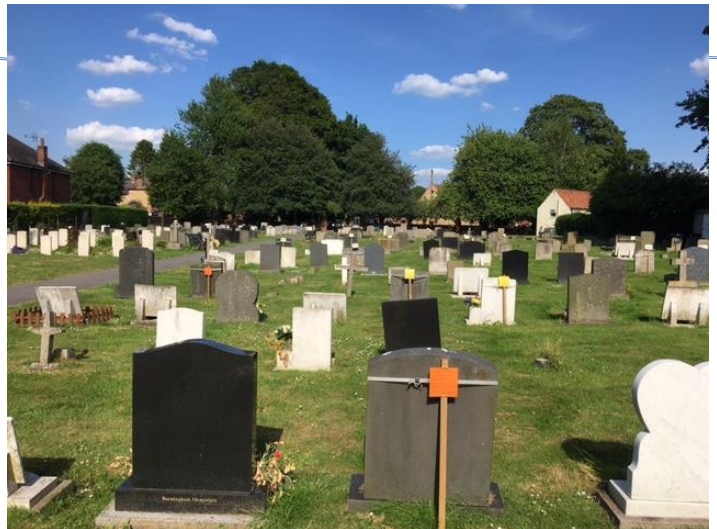
At the time of writing the owners of 34 graves have organised and paid for remedial work and we are grateful for their swift action. Unfortunately, about 59 gravestones remain in a hazardous condition.

Several graves have had their inspection boards removed but owners/relatives have not necessarily contacted the Council and they need to do so urgently.

We have tried to contact owners and relatives but the situation about the headstones cannot be left any longer.

Leaving the memorial stones standing in disrepair is a potential hazard to visitors to the cemetery. The decision to lie them down is a sad one which is not taken lightly. Hence this is a final notice to get in touch.

Any owner or relative should contact Kirton in Lindsey Town Council by **4pm 14th July 2022**. After that the Town Council will with deep regret, have no option under Health and safety to make appropriate but respectful arrangements to lay down the headstones concerned.
