Step 2 of the government's Road Map Out of Lockdown began 12/04/2021 and further easing is expected throughout May and June.


Please remember to wear a mask or face covering, regularly wash and sanitise your hands, stick to social distancing measures and keep safe.

# Town Council Meetings update



As the legislation allowing local councils to legally hold their meetings remotely comes to an end on 6<sup>th</sup> May, and the government's plans do not currently include extending this legislation, the Town Council has moved the Annual Council Meeting forward to 6<sup>th</sup> May and, unless the situation changes, will postpone further meetings until the end of June in order that all safety measures can be considered and meetings remain open to all members of the public.

Following the Appeal decision by the Inspectorate, residents and Kirton in Lindsey Town Council continue to be extremely concerned about the potential development. The Town Council has written formally to North Lincolnshire Council pushing for a judicial review on this decision and highlighting the errors it believes the Inspectorate has made when coming to the decision to allow the Appeal. A response is now awaited.

#### **Campagin against Dog Fouling**

Action against the small minority within our community who continue to burden the rest with problems of dog fouling continues. Headed by Cllr Fox, dedicated reporting and liaison with the Ward Councillors for the area has resulted in regular visits from Enforcement Officers and a visible reduction in the problem. Cllr Fox also organised a poster competition and the resulting two designs are displayed around the town to encourage everyone to be more considerate of others.
