Town Council Meetings update


Council and Committee meetings returned to physical settings in June, with the first face to face meeting of the Town Council since early March 2020 taking place at the Church Halls on St Andrew's Street on Wednesday 23rd June. Covid-safe measures were in place and the Council's July meetings will continue to take place in this way, but the venues may continue to vary as the available spaces are assessed in line with the anticipated numbers of people attending meetings and the limited venue spaces for organisations return to activities within the town.

Town Survey 2021

Kirton in Lindsey Town Council is conducting this survey in order to gain your views and opinions on aspects of the current facilities and events available within our town, in addition to proposed future amenities for our community.

The Town Council has a certain remit and is responsible for particular aspects of the town and community. An outline of the responsibilities of the Town Council – and what falls under the control of North Lincolnshire Council is displayed in the Town Council noticeboard, online and in the recent edition of Kirton First.

Existing facilities and events were created and are maintained using funding from a combination of the local element (Kirton in Lindsey)



within your annual Council Tax and various grants that are available to Local Authorities. For large projects, in addition to any supporting Grant Funding and North Lincolnshire Council support, Town Councils can access Public Works Loans, which are available at very low interest rates and repaid over many years to ensure minimal impact on annual Council Tax payments.

We need YOUR opinion on what we have within our community, and what you would like to see in the future so we can plan accordingly. We will let you know what results and opinions the survey reveals, and what the subsequent plans for the town will be.

A paper version of this survey will be available shortly to be delivered to households, in an attempt to reach as many residents as possible. More information about this will be published soon. The closing date for submissions will be published in advance when agreed.

The Local Government Boundary Commission has launched a consultation which will lead to recommendations about new council wards and boundaries, as well as numbers of councillors. Local people are urged to take part and share their views on where ward boundaries should be and what they should be called. From 18 May to 26 July 2021, they are accepting opinions and comments on where you believe ward boundaries should be in North Lincolnshire Council. The Commission is minded to recommend that North Lincolnshire Council should have 43 councillors in the future. This is no change from the current number of councillors. Environment Champion Award success for Jessie



On Friday June 18th North Lincolnshire's Young Mayor, Zaynah, presented Jessie with her Environment Champion Award. Many in the town will know that Jessie has become a dedicated litter picker and champion of the clean environment in Kirton in Lindsey following in the footsteps of her mum Lucy.

Jessie is out on multiple occasions each month with her mum and Jessie keeps count of the number of different types of litter collected, and one of her current concerns is counting the number of discarded face coverings that are collected each time she is picking up litter. Jessie's passion for keeping the town free from litter is infectious but disappointingly her hard work and dedication is still needed due to a minority who continue to cause litter problems in the town.

The Town Clerk nominated Jessie for the Award, believing that such community minded work deserves recognition and the rewarding of such behaviour encourages both the young and older generations who otherwise might become disheartened at the continued problems of litter and pollution.

Zaynah is really keen on encouraging young people to be part of the community and tackle environmental issues and so she was impressed to hear the amazing job Jessie is doing for one so young. During a rainy, socially distanced visit to the Town Hall garden in Kirton in Lindsey, Zaynah presented Jessie with a bag of goodies to reward her for her community minded action. The Mayor of Kirton in Lindsey, Cllr Pat Frankish, also attended, at Zaynah's suggestion, to show Jessie how appreciated she was and that her efforts were not going unnoticed.

The work links into Zaynah's efforts to raise awareness of environmental issues and encouraging children, young people and families to be part of making our communities a cleaner, greener and better place to live.

Traingate Project completion

"Grandad's Plough - In Memory of Harry and Fred Clarke" - created and designed by Tony Bartlett of Traingate was officially unveiled on Saturday afternoon.

Tony gathered the assistance of Jonathan Fallas for the building work required, Mick Holmes for internal metal work, Pete Yallop for paint and equipment, James Sutton for the ploughman sculpture and the plough was donated by John Barber. The plaques on the sides of the plinth were made by Jason Threadgold.

The Deputy Mayor of North Lincolnshire Council, Cllr John Briggs attended on Saturday and presented Tony with a plaque from the North Lincolnshire Council SSE Sustainable Development Fund which contributed £10,000 to the project. Ward Cllr Trevor Foster also attended following his assistance and support very early in the project to enable it all to begin.

Derek & Julie Lawrence created a drawing to bring Tony's idea to life and the photography skills of Maria and Bill Rhoades documented the project from start to finish.

The project was supported by Kirton in Lindsey Town Council and the Mayor, Cllr Pat Frankish led the unveiling event with Rev Kathy Colwell also performing a blessing of the new town landmark. Generous donations from residents also made the completion of the project possible with the youngest donators, Jessie & Adian, honoured with unveiling Grandad's Plough.



Library update

From Monday 28 June, library opening times and services across North Lincolnshire were updated in line with government guidance. Full information is available on the North Lincolnshire Council website.

North Lincolnshire Council have said:

"We will continue to ensure that our buildings are Covid Secure and that your visit is as safe as possible. This means we will limit the time you can spend in our buildings, and the number of people inside at any one time.

We will continue to review our offers and times available in line with future announcements. We are currently awaiting guidance regarding the library offer, which includes duration of use for digital access, and the amount of time customers can spend in our buildings. We will update this

once it has been confirmed. We will no longer be quarantining returned books, in line with new guidance. In person appointments can be made by booking directly with the relevant site, details of which can be found on our website."

The revised opening times from Monday 28 June for Kirton in Lindsey Library will be:

Tuesdays 2pm to 6pm Wednesdays 10am to 1pm Fridays 9am to 3.30pm (closed 12.30pm to 1pm) Saturdays 10am to 1pm
