A brief update on activities and news from Kirton in Lindsey Town Council.

## Budget and Precept set for 2022-23

At the Full Town Council Meeting on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2021, Councillors approved the budget for 2022-2023, setting it at £98.969.22. The Precept (the Town Council's share of council tax which appears as 'Kirton in Lindsey' on bills) was set at £97,500.00. By maintain existing spending levels, but carrying over unspent funds from the previous year, the Council are able to reduce the amount you pay by, on average, 9.2% on last year. The average household (Band D property) in Kirton in Lindsey will contribute £87.07 annually, which works out at just £1.67 per week. ## Peace Garden near the War Memorial

At the start of her term of office of Mayor, Cllr Pat Frankish made the War Memorial and Garden of Edward Elmhirst Duckering Charity (Registered Charity 248883) her chosen cause. This was with the intention to develop a Peace Garden near to the War Memorial which is within the objectives of this town charity which generates no income of its own. As the Civic Year 2021-2022 comes to an end, progress on the development of the Peace Garden has now started, with £3,578.53 raised through Civic Events and donations to Cllr Frankish's chosen charity. The design of the flower beds for the Peace Garden was adjusted and then redesigned in line with the wishes expressed by all interested parties and so the bed dug nearer to King Edward Street will no not be used and will be reseeded to return to grass. Planting of roses, crocuses and snowdrops has taken place, and in time the new Peace Garden will establish as a floral place of reflection for the town.

## Kirton-in-Lindsey Annual Town Meeting - Wednesday 13th April 2022 at the Town Hall - 6pm

The Annual Town Meeting is an opportunity for the community to come together. All residents are invited to attend and updates are sought from residents, businesses, organisations, clubs and societies from the town on the challenges the last few years have brought and the stories and successes coming out of those challenges for Kirton-in-Lindsey.

# KIRTON IN LINDSEY BUDGET 2022 - 2023

At the Full Town Council Meeting on 22nd December 2021, Councillors approved the budget for 2022-2023:

## £98,969.22

The average household (Band D property) in Kirton in Lindsey will contribute £87.07 annually, which works out at just

We are maintaining existing spending levels, but by carrying over unspent funds from the pervious year, we are able to reduce the amount you pay, by 9.2% on last year. This covers the following:

#### Charities: £2,000 (2.02%)

The Town Council look after 4 of the town's charities; 'Torksey Charity' and 'KLASSIC' both generate their own income. As 'The Green & The Market Place' and the 'War Memorial & Garden of Edward Elmhurst Duckering' have no income, the Town Council budget for upkeep and maintenance of these areas

#### Open Spaces: £22,639.22 (22.88%)

The Town Council's maintenance contracts look after The Green, including the War Memorial, the Cemetery, flower beds and areas around the boundary signs across the town. This area also covers the upkeep and provision of the play area at The Green, and maintenance of some heritage areas of the town

#### Grants & Donations:

£11,825 (11.95%) Every year, Kirton in Lindsey Town Council provides Grants and Donations to organisations based in Kirton in Lindsey, see www.kirtoninlindseytowncouncil.gov.uk for more details and how to apply for these

State -

Promoting Kirton in Lindsey: £11,990 (12.11%) Bringing events to our town, such as liaising with the Circus and Fair providers for the Green, and

the Circus and Fair providers for the Green, and the Christmas Festival, including the Christmas Lights in the central Market Place and floodlighting at the Church

Civic Duties: £1,700 (1.72%) Civic commitments including an annual Service and Dinner to build countywide relationships. This also covers the annual Civic Award

#### Burial Ground: £2.100 (2.12%)

The Town Council has burial authority esponsibilities, and this covers the maintenance and running of the town Cemetery at Grove Street.

Kirton in Lindsey Cemetery opened in 1940 and the Town Council now holds over 1287 records

Public Services: £400 (0.40%) To fund community sports for young people and the upkeep of the Town Clock



## New litter bins as part of central government 'Welcome Back' funding

North Lincolnshire Council have installed new bins around the town centre area this month.

These bins are provided via the central government Welcome Back grant received by North Lincolnshire Council to improve central areas of towns and villages across North Lincolnshire.

Older bins will be removed as part of this work, with the new bins offering improved capacity and separate sections for general waste and recycling.

Kirton in Lindsey Town Council continues to work with North Lincolnshire Council to improve the overall litter bin provision across Kirton in Lindsey. Once the installation of the new bins across North Lincolnshire is completed, the options for improving provision in other areas of the town will be considered. This will be following assessment, by North Lincolnshire Council, of the bins removed which can be rejuvenated and recycled into locations identified as in need.

Remember that you can dispose of bagged dog waste in all litter bins, and the new bins also now offer a separate section for recycling as well. North Lincolnshire Council will continue to carry out the emptying and the recycling of the waste disposed off into the new bins.



A couple of the new bins sited around the central areas of the town by North Lincolnshire Council include bins at South Cliff Road, King Edward Street, Station Road, High Street and in the Market Place. More improvements are hoped to follow in the coming months.



Advance notice – Kirton in Lindsey Road Closures – Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June 2022 – Jubilee Street Party

On Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June 2022 the Kirton in Lindsey Jubilee Street Party will be held in the Market Place, and everyone is invited to come along to join in the Queens Platinum Jubilee celebrations!

For this reason and for the safety of the public, there will be road closures in place around the Market Place from 7am till 7pm on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June.

You will find further information about our events over the Jubilee weekend on the Town Council/Hall websites, Facebook pages, within the March and May editions of Kirton First, local noticeboards and at our local business.



There will also be a road closure at the B1400 as you leave the York Road area towards Grayingham in the first week of April (Mon 4<sup>th</sup>- Wed 6<sup>th</sup>). This is for the water connection to be put into place by Anglian Water for the new allotment site. The working group are continuing to plan for the opening of the new site this year & those on the waiting list will be contacted in due course with further info about all things allotments!

## Play Area Update

The Play Area Development Group within the Town Council is currently at the later stages of engagement with 15 different play equipment providers to develop designs for the improvements to the play area requested by residents though the responses received to the play area questionnaire. Equipment at the play area is regularly inspected and as it continues to age more issues are developing with existing equipment. The toddler swings have been taken out of action due to safety concerns, and if other equipment presents similar concerns the safety of residents will be at the forefront of any action taken. As the development of the improvements continues, the timescale for replacements is difficult to predict, however Councillors are working hard in the background to improve the facilities and improvements are on their way.

A Town Council working group focusing on improving tourism for Kirton in Lindsey is working with North Lincolnshire Council and other local groups.
