Airfields of Britain Memorial – a new memorial for Kirton in Lindsey.

The Airfields of Britain Conservation Trust will be unveiling a memorial commemorating Kirton in Lindsey Airfield on **Sunday 7th August at 11am**. This will be the Trusts' 198th memorial across Britain.

The location will be the junction of South Cliff Road and the B1400, chosen as the closest available area due to land ownership.

Everyone is invited to attend to see the memorial to the Kirton in Lindsey Airfield unveiled.

Play Area Development Update

After many months of meetings and discussions Kirton in Lindsey Town Council is excited to confirm that it will be working with Caloo this year to improve and further develop the play provision at the town Green off King Edward Street.

The results of the Play Area Survey which so many of you participated in were taken fully into account with the specification drawn up by a small Town Council working group in July last year. Specialists in play were consulted and assisted with the development of this work which was then put forward to play equipment suppliers for quotations.

Funding to enable the purchase and the installation of the equipment with as little cost to residents as possible was sought and significant levels of funding are now confirmed for this purpose.


So that play provision is still available throughout the school holiday period works are now scheduled to begin in September. This will result in the closure of the play area across two phases, the 'toddler area' within the fenced area will be closed and developed first. The 'junior area' works are expected to begin in October.

More information will follow over the coming weeks, and the Town Council look forward to working closely with Caloo on this project to improve play and recreation provision for the town.

The results of the surveys carried out as well as feedback from residents clearly demonstrate the need for increased recreation facilities in addition to this piece of work, and Kirton in Lindsey Town Council continue to look seriously at how more can continue to be achieved.

For now, below is the graphic by Caloo for the first phase of work to improve and develop the toddler area on the town Green. Look out for more information over the coming weeks about the project.

Thank you to all residents who have completed surveys and provided feedback to help with the development and progress of this project so far.

Cemetery update

It is with the deepest regret that Kirton in Lindsey Town Council give notice that the process will now begin to lay down some headstones in the cemetery.

One of the duties of the Town Council is the maintenance of the Cemetery. Health and Safety legislation dictates that risks in the Cemetery must be controlled, including work to actively remove hazards posed by unstable memorial stones. Over the past year, we have instructed an independent inspection undertaken of all graves and headstones, and provided information on a regular basis about the next steps.

The Town Council is extremely grateful to the memorial owners who have taken action to make memorials safe and who have kept in contact with the Town Council about this matter.

Leaving memorial stones known to be a hazard standing in disrepair is not an option and the decision to lie them down is a sad one which is not taken lightly and has followed months of discussion and communication.

Following the notification last month, the Town Council will now with deep regret, have no option under health and safety to make appropriate but respectful arrangements to lay down the headstones concerned. Anyone with any queries is welcomed to contact the Town Council for further information.


