
5. What would encourage you to take part in the future?




7. Would you be prepared to pay for the map? i.e. to help cover the printing costs.

Perhaps the Scarecrows and Kirton Karts could take part on alternate years. Ask questions to those who have just moved to Kirton and don't just presume everyone knows what you're talking about. Halloween ones? I love it, thanks for organising it! Maybe let people vote on social media as well as going round and voting! Think more people would vote this way. Many already do, but encouraging the clubs and organisations in the town perhaps by invitation to participate. More events should be held in the town to bring everyone together. The community is too divided. Get local charities involved as they can generate publicity for the event and improve attendance. Please don't stop! I think many people, myself included, don't know how to start. So some stories from people who do them, or even some video clips of them being made, would help people make that start. feel like sharing photos on the community page stops people going out to look for them. I think once a year is enough. Better event publicity. Not everyone is on Facebook/internet. Town Council should join in and Councillors/Clerks should have a scarecrow on display on behalf of the Council. As some residents are not on social media or able to walk around the village, maybe using the town hall have a photo display of each scarecrow. Not just the front of the scarecrow, but back and sides. That way they are all in one place and easily accessible. Nothing really, perhaps encourage more participants by getting schools to ask children to encourage their parents? Stop doing such rubbish. An option for a smaller entry, albeit a separate category, to encourage people with smaller gardens or less time and resources, such as a Plant Pot Person. People can enter on a small or grand scale.
